## 1. Call To Order

## 2. Review and approval of Minutes dated September 11, 2012

## 3. Parking Ticket Appeals by David Pfeifle, City Attorney and Matt Nelson, Public Parking Facilities Manager

Pfeifle provided background information regarding the work done on improving the administrative appeals process. He stated these proposed revisions are designed to place the parking ticket appeals under the same process as any other agency decisions through the administrative appeal process.

Pfeifle stated this will provide citizens the due process they deserve. Citizens will know that their appeals, filed internally with the City, are being heard by two fair and impartial hearing examiners. The examiners were hired through an RFP process last April.

A motion was made by Council Member Sue Aguilar and seconded by Council Member

Michelle Erpenbach to move this item forward for review by the full City Council. Anderson Jr. called for a voice vote and all members present voted yes. **Motion Passed.**

**4. Subdivision Construction by Chad Huwe, City Engineer**

Huwe gave a Subdivision Update providing: an overview of the current subdivision construction process; an update on the construction status of subdivisions; and introducing the proposed subdivision construction process.
